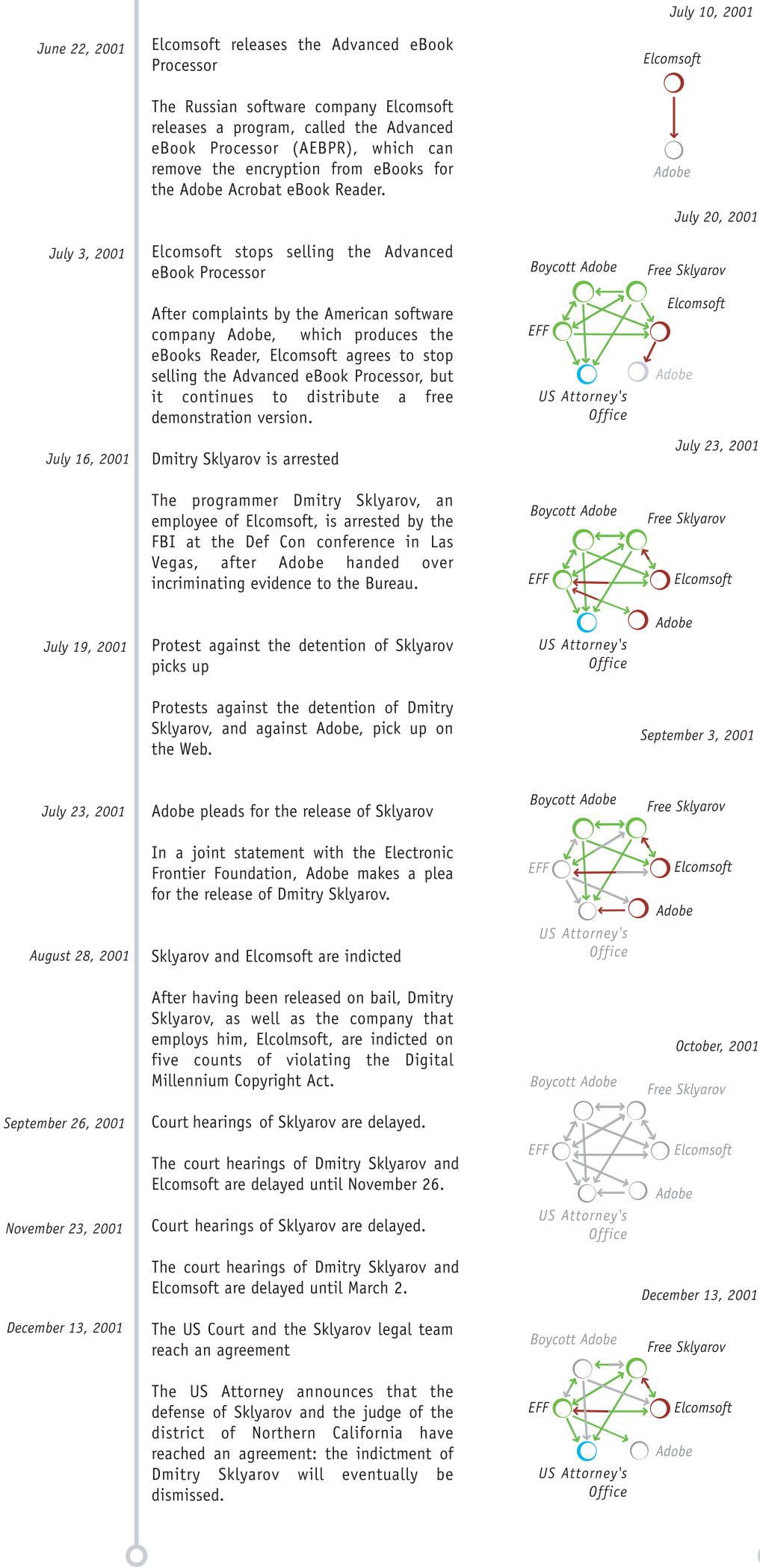


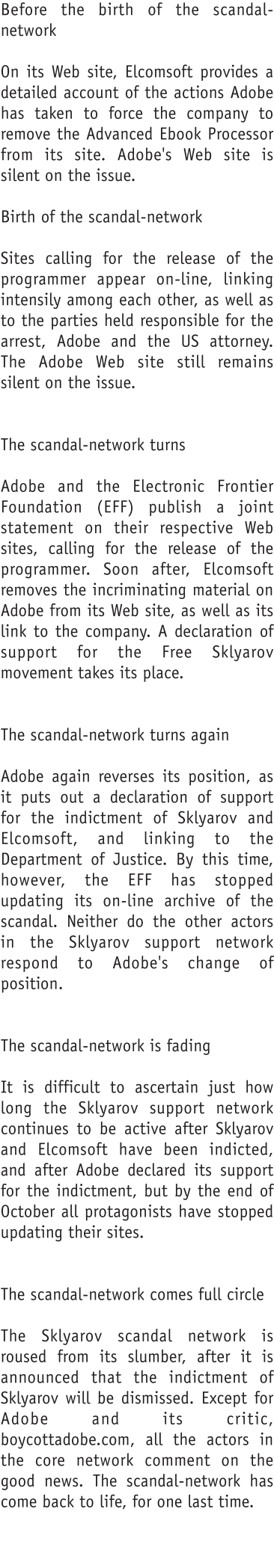

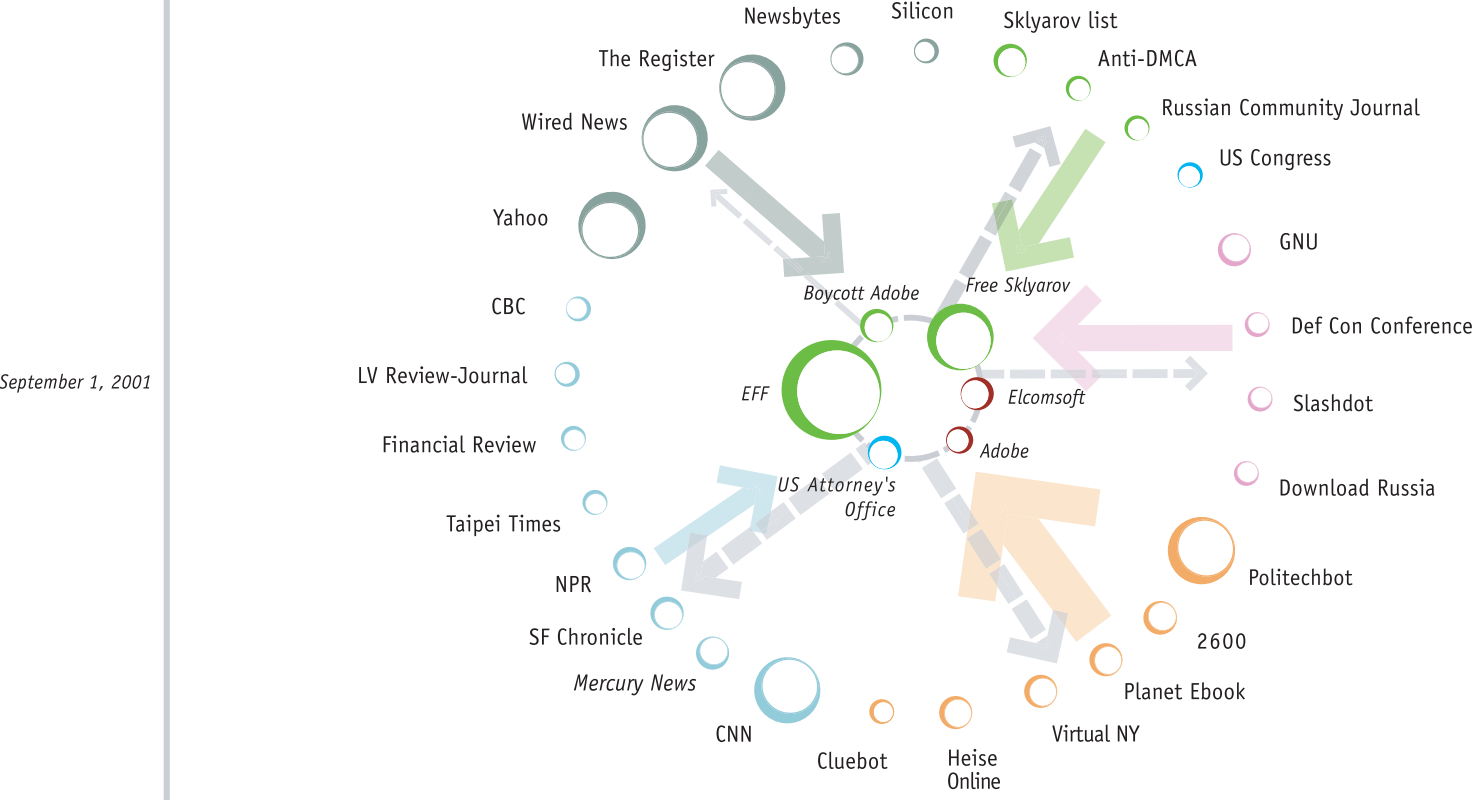
Shapshots of the core scandal-network

Snapshot of the extended scandal-network



The extended scandal-network: interlinkings between the core network and the scandal support network.

The extended scandal-network is made up of the protagonists in the affair (the core scandal-network) and the relevant actors that reported and supported the scandal on the Web (the scandal support network). It was located with the aid of the IssueCrawler.* This map shows the interlinkings between the core network and the scandal support network. The sizes of the arrows indicate the number of links going from an actor group to the core network, and vice versa. The sizes of the actors indicate relevance, in terms of the number of links each actor in the extended network receives from the even broader network treating the scandal on the Web. The actors of the core network were found by the IssueCrawler to be the most relevant actors of their respective groups.
